General Instructions: An Individual Mileage Record (IMVR) must account for all miles traveled.

## Notes:

- State/Provincial law requires the operator to keep a record of distance driven. You are the only person who can provide the information.
- Each Individual Vehicle Mileage Record (IVMR) must cover all distances traveled, including deadhead, bobtail, and personal miles/kilometers. Properly completed Individual Vehicle Mileage Records (IVMRs) will minimize fuel tax discrepancies. .
- Prepare a separate Individual Vehicle Mileage Record (IVMR) to cover the distance traveled for each vehicle used, including if your vehicle breaks down and you get a substitute vehicle.
